Dress Code

At Lotus College, we aim to create a professional and practical learning environment. To support this, all students must adhere to the required dress code and come prepared with the necessary tools and equipment to participate in classroom and kitchen-based training sessions.

Classroom Sessions:

Students are expected to attend in neat, smart-casual attire.

Practical Kitchen Sessions:

Students must wear the designated chef uniform and comply with safety standards during all kitchen training. Proper attire includes the chef uniform and non-slip kitchen shoes. Maintaining a clean and professional appearance is essential.

Uniform & Chef Kit Provided

As part of the materials and resource fee, Lotus College supplies each student with a Chef Uniform Starter Kit and a Chef's Toolkit during orientation. These essentials are designed to support you from day one of practical training.

Chef Uniform Starter Kit (provided)

- 1 x White double-breasted chef jacket (with white buttons)
- 1 x Checkered chef trousers (modern or traditional style)
- 1 x White bib apron
- 1 x White neckerchief
- 1 x White chef skull cap

Note: Students are required to purchase their own heavy-duty, black, fully enclosed, non-slip kitchen shoes. Sneakers or runners are not permitted.

Chef Starter Toolkit (provided)

- 1 x 25cm or 30cm Chef's knife
- 1 x Paring knife
- 1 x Vegetable peeler
- 1 x Thermometer
- 1 x Palette knife
- 1 x Boning knife
- 1 x Fish filleting knife
- 1 x Utility fork
- 1 x Sharpening steel
- 1 x Sharpening stone

- 1 x Reusable piping bag
- 1 x Set of piping nozzles

Additional or replacement items can be purchased independently if needed.

Learning Technology & Stationery
